One hundred and thirty-nine Canadian athletes, many most of whom will participate in the 1976 Olympics in Montreal, arrived here in Havana at 1:30 am this morning. and in 78

The Canadian athletes will train here in Cuba for two weeks. During their stay, they will ~~xxxxx~~ train alongside them Cuban teams and compete with them in the eight sports, mens and womens volleyball, womens basketball, soccer, diving, water polo, wrestling, ~~fencing~~ and fencing.

It was 78 degrees here in Havana as the Boeing Transair Boeing 707 landed at ~~xxxxx~~ ~~xxxxx~~ ~~xxxxx~~

The Canadian athletes, sports officials, ~~and newsmen~~ reports and TV crews, 175 in all, were were driven in special buses to Jibocoa, a beach resort outside of Havana. where they will

The Canadian athletes sports officials, reporters and TV crews were taken from the airport to Jibocoa, a beach resort outside of Havana. They will be housed at Jibocoa during their ~~two week~~ stay. ~~The teams~~ ^{HERE BUT} will train at sports facilities within the city of Havana itself. The first training sessions ~~will~~ begin later today.
