FOR THE CUBAN CONSUMER SUGAR ONLY COSTS SEVEN CENTS A POUND, rationed at four pounds per person per month. THAT RATIONING ALLOWS THE CUBANS TO ~~SELL~~ SELL AS MUCH SUGAR AS POSSIBLE OVERSEAS.

JUST YESTERDAY, ONE OF THE MANY CANADIAN TOURISTS HERE IN HAVANA TOLD ME THAT WHEN HE RETURNS TO CANADA HE'S GOING TO TAKE WITH HIM A BOX OF HAVANA CIGARS, TWO BOTTLES OF FINE CUBAN RUM AND - WHAT DO YOU THINK - A TEN POUND BAG OF CUBAN SUGAR AT SEVEN CENTS A POUND..
