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havana, feb 16, reuter -- a salvadorean guerrilla spokesman said at a press conference here that his nation's national liberation front is working on a plan for a negotiated political solution to the struggle.

miguel saenz, of the international relations committee of the farabundo marti front for national liberation, said: "we are developing all forms of struggle -- the armed struggle -- and also, at the same time, we are elaborating a proposal for a negotiated political solution."

"we understand clearly," saenz said, "that in the present difficult world situation in which the government of the united states is headed by war-mongers, an armed conflict in any region of the world constitutes a focus of tension that threatens world peace."

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'ana maria,' who was introduced as a member of the leading council of the front for national liberation, said that revolutionary forces, divided into four principal fronts, control one third of salvadorean territory.

she said that a regular revolutionary army was being organised in addition to the present guerrilla and militia forces.

'ana maria' declared that the front's decision to seek a negotiated solution +does not mean that the struggle is waning or that we are ready to lay down our weapons.+

saenz said that guerrilla forces have taken more than 50 government soldiers as prisoners. +the policy that we follow with the prisoners,+ he said, +is to free them through institutions, mainly the red cross, with the exception of murderers.+
