Fidel Castro told one millions Cubans gather in Revolution Square here in Havana that Cuban would never renounce its right to support the Puerto Rican independence movement and what he called, the independence struggles of Africa. "We will defend Angola and Africa with our blood and we mean it seriously," he said. Dr. Castro accused the United States of launching the the South African army against the MPLA goverment of Angola.
